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¹ The rankings appropriate for North American academic system are used in this translation. Russian original system is based on five ranks, in ascending order: mladshij prepodavatel (roughly, equivalent of an instructor), prepodavatel (assistant professor), starshij prepodavatel (associate professor), docent (this one is absent in the US, but can be compared with a non-tenured senior faculty member), and professor (tenured professor) (I. Kh).

 2 The Russian system of scholarly degrees is different from Master's — Doctoral degrees format. It is especially evident in the field of music since the Russian pedagogical system offers a stage of early professional musical education (7-year children's school and 4-year utchilische) that does not exists in the West. Keeping this in mind, one may evaluate the Dipom of the conservatory as an equivalent of Master's Degree, the Candidate of Arts as the equivalent of Ph. D. or DMA and the Doctor of Arts as a special degree that is given to a prominent figure in the field after minimum of 10 years of successful teaching and research career (I. Kh.).

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
